And his bizarre technique has won him fans across the country. The former handbag salesman claims he's eased heart palpitations, curvature of the spine, frozen shoulders and dodgy knees.

Coby sends 'magnetic' signals down the phone which, he believes, can move limbs, twist torsos and manipulate minds.

Now he's come up with a psychic twist . . . the Cure-all Power Card.

It's a specially-prepared plastic card to CHARGE believers with positive energy when he's not around.

The Coby Card can be used for "addictive problems . . . learning abilities love, goodness and happiness."

Louise Drover, from Jordanhill, and Kilbirnie man Ernest Evens are among the 500 people who've laid out £25 for the plastic wonder.

Ernest, cured in 1993, said: "I could hardly move my neck, but now I can move it normally and the pain is gone."

Coby claims everyone is surrounded by a field of energy.

"When I was younger, I saw lights round things and could make people move their limbs involuntarily," he says.

What started as a party trick among friends has now become a full-time career.

The 34-year-old Israeli-born Mancunian added: "It's a suggestive technique that proves energy can be directed in a primitive way."
